FORMAT

- 54-hole stroke play competition with a field size of 144 and a cut after 36 holes
 - Round 1 Monday, August 25
 - O Round 2 Tuesday, August 26 Field cut to low 40 & ties following round completion
 - o Round 3 Wednesday, August 27
- Approximate yardage of 7,100 yards
- Top 10 & ties will be exempt for 2026 Ohio Amateur Championship

ENTRY FEE & PROCEDURE

- \$300 Entry Fee for all entries
 - Range use, cart fees, & lunchs included
- Practice rounds can be booked between August 12 & 24. Practice round fee is \$70 including cart. Contact club for availability,
- No refunds after the deadline unless submitted with a medical excuse, all refunds are subject to a \$15 service fee.
- Contestants, including exempt players, shall apply online at OhioGolf.org

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be a male who has reached their 25th birthday on or before August 25.
- All entrants must have an active WHS handicap index of 5.4 or better.
- Must be a resident of the state of Ohio as defined below.
- A resident is defined as meeting four (4) of the following nine (9).
 - 1. Ownership or leasing Ohio residence
 - 2. Proof of payment of utilities of property where residency is being claimed
 - 3. Ohio homestead exemption declared on residence
 - 4. Place of employment in Ohio
 - 5. Ohio driver's license
 - 6. Ohio vehicle registration
 - 7. Ohio address listed on federal income tax
 - 8. Has a WHS handicap at a golf club in Ohio
 - 9. Voter registration in Ohio

Caddies, & Transportation

- Caddies are permitted. A player may not have another player who has or will compete in the same round as his or her caddie during the round.
 - Breach of Local Rules result in the general penalty for each hole during which the player is helped by such a
 caddie. If the breach occurs between holes, the player gets the general penalty for the next hole. See Model
 Local Rule H-1.2

Shoes & Specifications of Club & Ball

- Players must not wear the following shoes.
 - Traditional spikes having single or multiple points designed to penetrate deeply into the surface of the ground, regardless of material.
 - Spikes of any design that are entirely or partially made of metal, if such metal may come in contact with the course. Rule 4.3. Model Local Rule G-7.
- List of conforming driver heads: Local Rules as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Local Rule G-1.
- List of conforming golf balls: Local Rules as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures in in affect. Local Rule
 G-3.
